# I give you a commandment: love one another.

I was leading a class on Baptism the other day trying to describe to the children light and darkness. Children are fascinating because although they hadn't completely wrapped their head around metaphors, analogy and parable, they were still able to speak profoundly of what it meant to be like light and the things that communicated darkness. At Baptism you're given the light from the Paschal Candle and the prayer is "Receive the light of Christ...th's child of yours has been enlightened by Christ...May they keep the flame of faith alive in their hearts." We entrust this light to parents to be kept burning brightly.

John's Gospel plays with this motif of light and darkness, and this weekend begins with 'When Judas had gone.' Although a short line, it's meaning puts in motion the activity of darkness. Judas, in the shadows, moves to betray the light who is Christ. If we recall back to the beginning of John's Gospel it says, "The Word was the true light that enlightens all people."

Jesus, who came into the world to enlighten all people, and who we honour Jesus in our rituals and Sacraments engage the light, but ultimately, we're called to promote the light. They say that 'darkness is the absence of light', and within the Christian context, I think it's a call for people who have been enlightened by Christ to truly model his example as often as possible. Much like the other saying, 'bad things happen when good people do nothing.'

A lot of bad things are happening in the world as we speak. I lament my limitations seeing the pain that is out there and not being able to respond to all of it. Amidst all the darkness of this world, maybe we might be able to provide a bit of light to those around us. Perhaps we can contribute to the removing the darkness in our homes and social circles. In fact, it's a mission we were given at our Baptism. Since we were given the light of Christ, and then Confirmed it's presence at Confirmation, we now take the torch out into the world. We can keep it burning brightly by sharing it. How will we pass this light onto someone new this week?

## First Reading

## Acts 14: 21-27 Gospel

John 13: 31-33, 34-35

Paul and Barnabas went back through Lystra and Iconium to Antioch. They put fresh heart into the disciples, encouraging them to persevere in the faith. 'We all have to experience many hardships' they said 'before we enter the kingdom of God.' In each of these churches they appointed elders, and with prayer and fasting they commended them to the Lord in whom they had come to believe.

They passed through Pisidia and reached Pamphylia. Then after proclaiming the word at Perga they went down to Attalia and from there sailed for Antioch, where they had originally been commended to the grace of God for the work they had now completed.

On their arrival they assembled the church and gave an account of all that God had done with them, and how he had opened the door of faith to the pagans.

When Judas had gone Jesus said:
'Now has the Son of Man been glorified, and in him God has been glorified.
If God has been glorified in him,
God will in turn glorify him in himself, and will glorify him very soon.
'My little children,
I shall not be with you much longer.
I give you a new commandment:
love one another;
just as I have loved you,
you also must love one another.
By this love you have for one another,

everyone will know that you are my disciples.'

## Apocalypse 21:1-5






