Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

The Gospel of today tells us that the Son of Man came to seek out the lost and save the sinner. Here we have the story of Zacchaeus the leader of the tax collectors. The person who is curious to see Jesus and encounter him and finds himself receiving the master in his own house over a meal. The encounter of the divine and human in this context leads Zacchaeus to his total conversion and reconcilia-

Zacchaeus who was a seeker of Jesus. Do we still seek after Jesus? Zacchaeus had what he wanted; he didn't have what he needed. What he needed was an honest life and good relations in his community. He did not have the respect of his neighbours. Zacchaeus knew he made his wealth off the misery of his neighbours. In doing that he also knew he had turned his back on God of his ancestors. he had plenty of gold in his pockets, he was spiritually bankrupt. So, we find him seeking to see Jesus. His intentions may not have been perfect, but we do not have to be perfect to attract God's attention and concern.

Jesus saw the seeker and took the first step. He called Zacchaeus by his name. He invited himself to the sinner's home. In the presence of Jesus Zacchaeus was reconciled with God, his past was forgiven, and a new relationship was formed. Then Jesus said Today salvation has come to this house. The Lord Jesus is always ready to make his home with each one of us. Do you make room for him in your heart and in every area of your life? "Lord Jesus, come and stay with me. Fill my life with your peace, my home with your

So he ran ahead and climbed a sycamore tree to catch a glimpse of Jesus who was to pass that way. When Jesus reached the spot he looked up and spoke to him: 'Zacchaeus, come down. Hurry, because I must stay at your house today.' And he hurried down and welcomed him joyfully. They all complained when they saw what was happening. 'He has gone to stay at a sinner's house' they said. But Zacchaeus stood his ground and said to the Lord, 'Look, sir, I am going to give half my property to the poor, and if I have cheated anybody I will pay him back four times the amount.' And Jesus said to him, 'Today salvation has come to this house, because this man too is a son of Abraham; for the Son of Man has come to seek out and save what was lost.'

Youth Corner

GOD IS REAL

My dear young friends, I think this is the very best explanation of the concept of God. I received it the other day from a good friend, a retired Monk. The story goes:

In a mother's womb were twins. One asked the other: "Do you believe in life after delivery?" The other replied: "Why, of course. There has to be something after delivery." "Nonsense" said the first. "There is no life after delivery. What kind of life could that be?" The second said: "I don't know but there'll be more light than here. Maybe we will walk with our legs and eat from our mouths. Maybe we'll have other senses that we can't understand now." The first replied: "That is absurd. Walking is impossible. And eating with our mouths? Ridiculous!
