 13 October 2019 - Year C**

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

On this twenty-eight Sunday the gospel focuses on the theme of Thanksgiving. While Jesus was on his way to Jerusalem, ten lepers met him at the entrance to a village. Staying at a distance they called out to him, "Jesus, Master, have pity on us!" Jesus had pity on them and said: "Go and show yourselves to the priests."

The first reading also tells of a miraculous healing of a leper: that of Naaman the Syrian by the prophet Elisha. As the gospel says finding himself cured, one of them turned back praising God at the top of his voice and threw himself at the feet of Jesus and thanked him. The man was a Samaritan. Jews and Samaritans avoided each other. But in this group of Jew and Samaritan came together, stayed together and called on Jesus together. People who normally would have had nothing to do with each other shared life because the rest of the world had rejected them.

Today the sickness called leprosy may not be some thing external but internal. We can be disfigured by the sin of the world and our own participation in that sinfulness. Our lack of respect and concern for one another could be a new form of leprosy. Our prejudice and negative perception on our neighbour could be. We receive many gifts from God, but it is not the gifts nor even the recipient, but the giver upon whom we should focus. For catholic Christian the eucharist is the source and summit of the Christian life and eucharist literally means thanksgiving where we should seek God's mercy which brings healing of mind, heart, and body.

**HAVE YOUR SAY!
 Dornoch Terrace Safety Improvements Project**

For Everyone who uses St Francis of Assisi Church and Hall - We Need You to Have Your Say. Brisbane City Council has released a concept design safety improvements project between Gladstone Rd, Highgate Hill and Hardgrave Rd, West End. **The removal of a total of 115 car parking spaces** along Dornoch Tce, between Gladstone Rd and Hardgrave Rd, as well as the **permanent removal of the bus stops**, are some of the project impacts. The proposed alteration will specifically affect church attendance and use of our community hall. There will be no parking allowed in front of the church and its hall for hundreds of metres either side of the road. Two main Bus Stops close to the church and hall will also be removed.

To Have a Vulnerable Heart

We have all experienced that feeling: a sinking in our stomach, a lump in our throat, tears springing to our eyes. We have been let down, disappointed, rejected. Vulnerability is dangerous! We open ourselves up – perhaps in a friendship, an opportunity in ministry (or at school). Is it not safer to keep our heart closed and never get hurt? C.S. Lewis tells us, "To love at all is to be vulnerable.....but if we lock our heart up safe it will change, it will not be broken: it will become unbreakable, impenetrable and irredeemable."

Vulnerable Like Christ. To love at all is to be vulnerable. To love and live as Christ did, we have to take the step. We have to open our hearts. Christ made Himself vulnerable to us. Look to the Cross! That is the ultimate picture of vulnerability, the ultimate picture of love. If we want to be like Him, we must imitate His vulnerability. Jesus is calling us into a relationship with Himself. Have we entered fully, or are we holding back? He is asking us to be vulnerable with Him in prayer....He is listening. He knows our hearts. Tell Him your insecurities, your hurts, your anxieties. Offer Him your life – ask Him to help you offer it, day by day, hour by hour and moment by moment... We are not alone; Jesus walks with us. Jesus came to intimately experience our unique human lives and sufferings. We have a God who is united with us..... Allow him to transform you. Thank god that we have vulnerable hearts! A vulnerable heart is a heart for relationship, a heart for giving and loving. It is the key to living life in and with Christ, and by doing this we give the Holy Spirit the chance to work in us and through us to bring about the glory of God.
