Dear brothers and sisters in Christ

This week's readings invite us to rejoice in a God who longs to forgive us. No-one is beyond the reach of God's grace. We are loved sinners who are welcomed home with great joy, regardless of how far we have strayed. Let's ask God to help us become more deeply aware of the eternal heart's love and compassion, and desire to forgive the penitent sinner. Wherever and whatever our circumstances, God will always seek us out.

In this Gospel passage Luke has put together three parables all stressing the dynamic of lost and found. The point the evangelist is making in each case is the generous willingness God demonstrates in accepting back the repentant sinner. In the first parable the repentant sinner is symbolised in the lost sheep. The second parable focuses on the lost coin. The third parable presents a younger son and an elder son both of whom are lost. Luke makes it clear in each case, whether the man or the woman or the father, who assertively go after what is lost until found. Clearly the worth of an object depends on the value we choose to place on it. If we lose something valuable we want to find it again quickly, even if it has only sentimental value. Jesus' message here is that nobody is insignificant in the eyes of God. We are all valued more than we can imagine.

In these parables Jesus presents us with picture of God whose generosity extends beyond any human generosity. He compares God's unfailing forgiveness and mercy to a shepherd searching out the one stray out of a flock of ninety-nine; to a woman who drops everything to look for a lost coin; and to the father who watches out for his 'prodigal'

son and runs out joyfully to meet him. Let us return to our heavenly father who is ever ready to welcome us as His children and experience the joy of living in the presence of the Lord.

Gospel

Luke 15:1-32

The tax collectors and the sinners were all seeking the company of Jesus to hear what he had to say, and the Pharisees and the scribes complained. 'This man' they said 'welcomes sinners and eats with them.' So he spoke this parable to

them: 'What man among you with a hundred sheep, losing one, would not leave the ninety-nine in the wilderness and go after the missing one till he found it? And when he found it, would he not joyfully take it on his shoulders and then, when he got home, call together his friends and neighbours? "Rejoice with me," he would say "I have found my sheep that was lost." In the same way, I tell you, there will be more rejoicing in heaven over one repentant sinner than over ninety-nine virtuous men who have no need of repentance. 'Or again, what woman with ten drachmas would not, if she lost one, light a lamp and sweep out the house and search thoroughly till she found it? And then, when she had found it, call together her friends and neighbours? "Rejoice with me," she would say "I have found the drachma I lost." In the same way, I tell you, there is rejoicing among the angels of God over one repentant sinner.' He also said, 'A man had two sons. The younger said to his father, "Father, let me have the share of the estate that would come to me." So the father divided the property between them. A few days later, the younger son got together everything he had and left for a distant country where he squandered his money on a life of debauchery. 'When he had spent it all, that country experienced a severe famine, and now he began to feel the pinch, so he hired himself out to one of the local inhabitants who put him on his farm to feed the pigs. And he would willingly have filled his belly with the husks the pigs were eating but no one offered him anything. Then he came to his senses and said, "How many of my father's paid servants have more food than they want, and here am I dying of hunger! I will leave this place and go to my father and say: Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you; I no longer deserve to be called your son; treat me as one of your paid servants." So he left the place and went back to his father.

'While he was still a long way off, his father saw him and was moved with pity. He ran to the boy, clasped him in his arms and kissed him tenderly. Then his son said, "Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you. I no longer deserve to be called your son." But the father said to his servants, "Quick! Bring out the best robe and put it on him; put a ring on his finger and sandals on his feet. Bring the calf we have been fattening, and kill it; we are going to have a feast, a celebration, because this son of mine was dead and has come back to life; he was lost and is found." And they began to celebrate.

'Now the elder son was out in the fields, and on his way back, as he drew near the house, he could hear music and dancing. Calling one of the servants he asked what it was all about, "Your brother has come" replied the servant "and your father has killed the calf we had fattened because he has got him back safe and sound." He was anary then and refused to go in, and his father came out to plead with him; but he answered his father, "Look, all these years I have slaved for you and never once disobeyed your orders, yet you never offered me so much as a kid for me to celebrate with my friends. But, for this son of yours, when he comes back after swallowing up your property - he and his women you kill the calf we had been fattening."

'The father said, "My son, you are with me always and all I have is yours. But it was only right we should celebrate and rejoice, because your brother here was dead and has come to life: he was lost and is found."

Youth Corner

Why Pray the Rosary?

Sometimes, it can be difficult to grasp the importance of the rosary. You may even ask, "Why pray a repetitive prayer that causes my mind to drift, instead of speaking to God from my

Although speaking to God 'from the heart' is certainly necessary, I've learnt that it's also important to include the rosary in our prayer lives. There are several reasons why, but for the time being I'll give you one example of how the daily rosary can create miracles.

On 6 August, 1945, an atomic bomb was dropped on Hiroshima, instantly killing approx. 100,000 people. However, a church of Our Lady's Assumption (which was near the hypocentre of the attack) and its Jesuit priests survived. Apparently, they were examined by dozens of doctors several times over the years since the attack and no trace of radiation had been found in their bodies. So how did they survive? Said one of the priests: "We believe that we survived because we were living the message of Fatima. We lived and prayed the rosary daily in that home."

Has it been a while since you've prayed the rosary? It's time to book out some time to pray the rosary with our Blessed Mother.
