
Dear Friends

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ

As we are on the last weekend of the month in August we have the gospel of Luke 13:22-30 for our reflection. The life - our own way for his way. word of God here speaks about the salvation of souls. 'Lord, will those who are saved be few?' This is the question asked by one of the followers of Jesus. To that Jesus gives a God bless you and have great weekend beautiful answer saying try entering through narrow gate. Fr. Joshy Prappully Ofm Cap By saying he was speaking not "how many" will be saved Parish priest. but "how" one will be saved.

What does it mean by this narrow door? It is Jesus Christ himself. Jesus is the door to the kingdom of heaven. "I am the door" if anyone enters by me, he will be saved (John 10:9). And how he became the door for all humanity; it is through his passion and death. God sent his only begotten Son, the Lord Jesus Christ, to open the way for us to have full access to the throne of God's grace and mercy. Through Jesus' victory on the cross he has freed us from slavery to sin and hurtful desires and addictions, and he has made us sons and daughters of God and citizens of his heavenly kingdom. Thus, He has become the door for our entrance into his kingdom and has given an invitation to pass through narrow gate.

Our human nature is to have wide open doors; easy, comfortable and spacious doors. We don't like narrow and restricted paths. But the actual salvation is promised only when we try entering through narrow gate which Jesus Himself has given us; the path of self sacrifice and taking up the daily cross which are inevitable to our lives. READINGS AT MASS

Entrance Antiphon Cf. Ps 85: 1-3 Turn your ear, O Lord, and answer me; save the servant who trusts in you, my God. Have mercy on me, O Lord, for I cry to you all the day long.

First reading Isaiah 66:18-21

The Lord says this: I am coming to gather the nations of every language. They shall come to witness my glory. I will give them a sign and send some of their survivors to the nations: to Tarshish, Put, Lud, Moshech, Rosh, Tubal, and Javan, to the distant islands that have never heard of me or seen my glory. They will proclaim my glory to the nations. As an offering to the Lord they will bring all your brothers, on horses, in chariots, in litters, on mules, on dromedaries, from all the nations to my holy mountain in Jerusalem, says the Lord, like Israelites bringing oblations in clean vessels to the Temple of the Lord. And of some of them I will make priests and Levites, says the Lord.

Gospel

Hebrews 12:5-7,11-13

Have you forgotten that encouraging text in which you are addressed as sons? My son, when the Lord corrects you, do not treat it lightly; but do not get discouraged when he reprimands you. For the Lord trains the ones that he loves and he punishes all those that he acknowledges as his sons. Suffering is part of your training; God is treating you as his sons. Has there ever been any son whose father did not train him? Of course, any punishment is most painful at the time, and far from pleasant; but later, in those on whom it has been used, it bears fruit in peace and goodness. So hold up your limp arms and steady your trembling knees and smooth out the path you tread; then the injured limb will not be wrenched, it will grow strong again.

Luke 13:22-30

Through towns and villages Jesus went teaching, making his way to Jerusalem. Someone said to him, 'Sir, will there be only a few saved?' He said to them, 'Try your best to enter by the narrow door, because, I tell you, many will try to enter and will not succeed.

'Once the master of the house has got up and locked the door, you may find yourself knocking on the door, saying, "Lord, open to us" but he will answer, "I do not know where you come from." Then you will find yourself saying, "We once ate and drank in your company; you taught in our streets" but he will reply, "I do not know where you come from. Away from me, all you wicked men!"

'Then there will be weeping and grinding of teeth, when you see Abraham and Isaac and Jacob and all the prophets in the kingdom of God, and yourselves turned outside. And men from east and west, from north and south, will come to take their places at the feast in the kingdom of God.

'Yes, there are those now last who will be first, and those now first who will be last.'

I'm watching a documentary about Hayao Miyazaki, a cofounder and (now retired) Director of Studio Ghibli. When he was making his last film, The Wind Rises, his team of 300 took over one year to create a scene that lasted only four seconds. Talk about perfectionism.

In this Sunday's Gospel (Luke 13:22-30) Jesus says, 'Try your best to enter by the narrow door, because, I tell you, many will try to enter and not succeed.' Jesus has such high standards for us it can be scary - in fact he requires that you choose Him over anything else, all the time.
